Looking at the video of the plane while near the highest altitude point of the video, there appears to be tiny whitish clouds that were positioned towards Moscow in direct flight pattern to St. Petersburg, which appear to suggest an explosion in flight path. I do not see contrails to indicate a missile strike, but that would not rule out a drone attack or a bomb planted in the airplane. I would not think a bird strike would blow off a wing. I do not think a drone could fly fast enough to intercept a jet. So the only plausible answer left is an explosion in the airplane, either fuel/oil leak in the engine (only a bad maintenance or old plane), inferior jet fuel/additives (like nitroglycerin in fuel, highly unlikely), or a cargo bomb or ammunition placed near the separated wing. The explosion blew a wing off, but the flight was not higher than ten thousand feet, although immediate decompression may have blown some passengers/crew out of the plane, the cockpit looked intact, and at the low altitude the passengers who survived the blast would still be awake and not succumbed to low oxygen. Most small light planes made in Brazil have parachutes so I was sad not to see one deployed. If the explosion could be determined to have exploded under Prigozhin's seat, then it was definitely retaliation for the Wagner coup attempt by state sponsors, or revenge from those Russia pilots being shot down by Wagner during Wagner march on Moscow. Seems as though the bomb was strategically placed in the fuselage, near the wing, detonated by altimeter. That is the most plausible answer noting no rocket contrails. But the plane seems to be falling straight down indicating that the pilots survived the initial blast, and the pilots scrambled to use the remaining working planes jet engine, using thrust and reverse, to hasten the speed of the falling plane, but to no avail. As usual with Prigozhin, so many possibilities...
